

House Dust Allergy

Overview

House dust is a major cause of allergy in persons with year-round complaints of runny or stuffy nose, sneezing and itch in the nose or throat. It can also trigger attacks of itchy, watery eyes and asthma in house dust-sensitive persons.



Risk Factors

- Allergic rhinitis
- Asthma
- Family history of asthma or allergies, such as hay fever, hives or eczema

Signs and Symptoms

Wheezing Coughing Breathlessness
Runny Nose Itchy Nose Itchy/ Watery Eyes

Skin Rashes Tight feeling in the chest



Investigation, Test and Procedures

Allergy testing, e.g. Skin prick test. Can determine whether house dust mites trigger your respiratory or dermatological symptoms.



Treatment

Allergen avoidance:

It can be difficult to avoid house dust mites altogether, but measures such as dust mite, resistant covers for bedding, and washing bedding in hot water (60°C) may help to reduce exposure.

Medications & Side Effects

Immunotherapy

- It involves administering controlled amount of dust mite allergy extracted regularly over years to help build up tolerance.
- It is the only treatment that targets the underlying cause of house dust mite allergy, not just the symptoms of allergy disease.
- By allowing the immune system to become tolerant to these allergens, immunotherapy can reduce or stop your symptoms, even after you stop treatment.
