

Simulation in Practice Gallery Guidelines

What this Gallery is about

It is a walk-through gallery for participants of Simulation Reconnect 2026 to share applications and practices of simulation to drive quality, safety, and/or organisation/systems learning in their contexts.

We invite entries that visually demonstrate *how simulation was used, what new insights emerged, and how these findings informed actions, decisions, or reflection*—to spark further learning and conversations with others at Simulation Reconnect.

Submission criteria

1. Entries will be only accepted through this link: <https://for.sg/simreconnect-gallerysub>



2. Entries will only be accepted for display in the Gallery if at least one contributor is a registered symposium attendee.
3. Abstracts are not required; please submit your work using the template for review for final display.
4. Entries will only be reviewed if received before ~~17 May 2026~~ **extended deadline of 1 June 2026**.

What can participants submit? / Theme of submission

Participants are to submit a landscape, digital display that demonstrate simulation applied in real systems context.

Entries may highlight challenges encountered, successes achieved, or partial wins from pilots and experiments. Formal study design and statistical outcomes are not required.

Entries may fall under these themes, including (but not limited to):

1. Application of Simulation for Improvement
 - a. In clinical outcomes
 - b. In team performance
 - c. In system-focused interventions
 - d. In testing and exploration of processes and systems
2. Building and leading effective simulation programmes
 - a. Use of modalities such as Visually Enhanced Mental Simulation and Simulated Patients
 - b. Faculty development programme and curriculum
3. Connecting simulation with quality improvement
 - a. Embedding simulation into quality improvement principles and methodology

How entries will be displayed / Gallery display format

- Entries will be displayed on a digital 55" LCD TV screen that is in **landscape mode**.
- Entries **will be displayed on the screen for 3 minutes and** looped throughout the day in the pre-function area of the Symposium on 17 July 2026.
- Contributors do not need to stand by their poster during the Symposium; there will be no Q&A segment.

File specifications for submission

- Entries should use the **Powerpoint slide template** here: <https://for.sg/simreconnect-gallerytemp>
- Entries should be **submitted in pdf or mp4 format**
- If entries are in an mp4 format, you may use the Powerpoint slide template as a title card as an introduction to the video.
- Entries should be a single file, limited to **20MB size**
- Should your entry be accepted for display, you may subsequently submit a higher resolution file.
- Layout of slide: 16:9; landscape orientation
- Entries should be **clear, accessible, and engaging**
 - Entries are encouraged to be creative and have a mix of narrative and visuals (e.g. diagrams, graphs, photos or screenshots of simulation process and materials, quotes of participant feedback, video, etc)
 - Entries will be **displayed on the screen for 3 minutes, and looped throughout the day**
 - As the display will not have audio output, if your entry contains a video, please add subtitles as needed
 - Total word count is recommended to be **under 500 words**
 - Entries can include links for audience to access supplementary materials (e.g. videos, downloadable templates, etc)

Recommended Elements of an Entry / Format

1. Title
2. Contributors (individual or team)
3. Organisation
4. Introduction:
 - a. Background
 - b. Aim
5. Description:
 - a. What was done:
 - i. Outline your strategy / approach for simulation (E.g. how simulation was used, type of simulation, modality, participants)
 - b. What was the impact:
 - i. Outputs of simulation: Key insights, assumptions challenged, risks identified, or issues made visible
 - ii. Effects of simulation: Actions taken, decisions influenced, or barriers encountered
6. Conclusion:
 - a. What have you learnt?
 - b. What is next, or how does this work translate to future work in this area?
 - c. What do you want people to remember?

How entries will be reviewed

Entries will be reviewed as visual displays that contribute to conversation and community learning on the practice of simulation, **not as scientific abstracts**.

Reviewers will consider your entry for inclusion to the Gallery and may give feedback or seek clarification on whether the entry:

- Clearly communicates the **background and aim**
- Demonstrates **intentional** use of simulation
- Articulates key **learning** generated
- Shows how findings were translated into **actions, decisions, or reflection**
- Is **relevant** to healthcare improvement, quality, safety, and/or organisation/systems learning

If the entry is accepted for display, reviewers' feedback and suggestions for refinements will be shared. You may also share a higher resolution file for your final entry.

FAQ

1. Do I need to submit an abstract?

No, you may submit your entry directly as the template provided which will be reviewed for acceptance into the final display.

2. Do I need to stand by my work on that day?

No, entries will be on automatic 3-minute loop format in the pre-function area throughout the day.

3. Is there a selection for an Award?

No, this gallery is to spark further learning and conversations with others at Simulation Reconnect. Hence, there will be no additional judging or ranking of entries for this event.

4. Is there a limit to how many entries can be submitted?

There is no limit to entries per contributor.

5. Is there a limit to how many contributors can be listed?

There is no limit to number of contributors per entry, however there should be one main contributor responsible for submitting the entry.
